1. On or about November 15, 2019, the plaintiff, John F. D'Aleo, was appointed Executor of the Estate of Janet P. D'Aleo a/k/a Janet M. D'Aleo ["D'Aleo"] by the Court of Probate, North Central Connecticut Probate District, in the State of Connecticut, and is authorized to act in that capacity.

2. On or about November 6, 2019, and for some time prior thereto, the defendant, Maryanne A. Hornish, was the owner and/or keeper of a dog named "Dexter."

3. On or November 6, 2019, at approximately 3:00 p.m., D'Aleo was lawfully on the premises located at 584 Thrall Avenue, Suffield, Connecticut.

4. At or about that same time and place, the dog owned by the defendant, Maryanne A. Hornish, attacked D'Aleo, knocking her to the ground and bit her savagely,



maiming and mutilating her lower extremities, thereby causing the plaintiff's decedent to sustain and suffer the catastrophic personal injuries and losses hereinafter set forth.

5. At all times relevant herein, D'Aleo was not committing a trespass or other tort, and was not teasing, tormenting, or abusing the dog owned by the defendant, Maryanne A. Hornish.

6. The defendant, Maryanne A. Hornish, is liable to the estate of D'Aleo for the personal injuries and losses sustained by the plaintiff's decedent as a result of this incident, pursuant to Section 22-357 of the Connecticut General Statutes.

7. As a result of the above-described incident involving the dog owned and/or kept by the defendant, Maryanne A. Hornish, D'Aleo sustained and suffered severe personal injuries and losses including significant bite wounds and lacerations to her lower extremities, resulting in flesh, muscle, and tendon loss; injuries to the nerves, muscles, and soft tissues of her body; and a shock to her entire nervous system, some or all of which resulted in her untimely death.

8. As a further result thereof, D'Aleo suffered extreme physical pain, emotional distress, and mental anguish prior to her death.

9. As a further result thereof, D'Aleo has been permanently deprived of the opportunity to pursue and enjoy life's activities.

10. As a further result thereof, the plaintiff, John F. D'Aleo, has been forced to incur financial obligations for ambulance, hospital, funeral, and burial expenses on behalf of the plaintiff's decedent, Janet P. D'Aleo a/k/a Janet M. D'Aleo.

**WHEREFORE**, the plaintiff claims money damages.


**WHEREFORE**, the plaintiff claims exemplary and punitive damages as to the Third and Sixth Counts as prescribed by law.

The amount in demand, exclusive of interest and costs, is in excess of FIFTEEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$15,000).


