



04/13/15 - At approximately 1315 hours, I was bit by the listed animal. The bite was completely unprovoked however did not break the skin. I also witnessed the same animal in the same incident immediately attack a student intern after it bit me. I was told that this animal was deemed adoptable. Both 512 and 565 were notified. 502 located the location of the video footage of the incident which both 565 and 512 watched. The footage clearly shows the dog attacking two different people, completely unprovoked. 565 and 512 requested that I inform behavorists Megan Alexander of the incident, which I did via email. - 503

04/20/15 - Yesterday I check our records for any new documentation on the animal in question. A new memo had been posted as a web memo on the 17th giving a narrative about how "caring and loveable" it is - suggesting that it had been deemed adoptable again or was never officially taken off adoptable. As of this date I have not been given any information on any action to remedy this situation nor any documentation as such. I will be filing a hazard report. - 503

M15-291651	13-Apr-2015	BEHAVIOR	03/13/15 - At approximately 1315 hours while moving multiple impounds, I stepped out of the intake room towards the sally port. In the hallways was a volunteer with the listed dog. Without looking at, reaching for, touching, calling, or any provocation at all; the dog lunge and bit me on the left hand. Due to my fingers being closed, the bite did not break the skin. The dog then immediately went after a student intern tech who was in the same hallway before the volunteer was able to pull the dog away. The dog continued to lunge and growl at everyone in the hallway. Both 512 and 565 were notified as well the contracted behaviorists. Note: the hallway camera caught the incident. 502 located the exact footage and showed it to myself, 512, and 565. It showed the incident exactly as I described 503

I have been described as: cute, fun, funny, beautiful, adorable, caring, and loveable. I love outdoor activities, people, and other dogs. I am a handsome boy who is a very mellow three year old. I am a simple boy. No frills. No drama. Low maintenance. I know my basic manners sit, stay, and wait at doors. Signing me up for a training class would help us learn new things together. Come on down and meet me today. Ask for Sparky!
M15-292301	19-Apr-2015	BEHAVIOR	On 4/14/15, I took A300378 out to try to provoke snapping or biting behavior. I got Sparky aroused and overstimulated and then placed my hands near his mouth to provoke him to get mouthy from several different approaches. I then attempted to see what his startle reflex would be when I startled him from behind and he just looked to see me and continued on. He was a fairly calm, relaxed dog throughout provocation. MA
M15-293069	25-Apr-2015	BEHAVIOR	I am adding my statement of what happened even thought it is on camera. I was in the intake room assisting with his intakes. while I did not see the attack i heard it. Matt walked out into the hallway and a second later I heard an intense very low tone bark/ growl and heard matt yell. This was not an over stimulation it was an unprovoked attack. 599
M15-293167	27-Apr-2015	BEHAVIOR	I saw the video footage of the incident involving Matt Diaz at the same time Ken Crane, Matt Diaz and Brian Whipple watched it. The volunteer was walking the dog through the hallway from the kennel to the Sallie Port. As she and the dog were passing the door to the intake room, the door suddenly opened and Diaz walked briskly out of the room and headed toward the kennels. As Diaz passed the dog, the dog jumped toward him, was caught by the leash and came back to the volunteer. I could not see if the dog's teeth hit Diaz's hand as the video was not that clear. Approximately 10-20 seconds later, an intern walked out of the Intake Room and the dog did the same thing. Again, the footage
			was not clear enough to see if the dog went to bite or just jumped up on her. The volunteer who was walking the dog, pulled the dog away to continue to walk out of the hallway and exited into the Sally Port. The dog did not lunge, snap or jump on anyone else. 563 AJ

			the video footage. It was listed that the dog "jumped" at both myself and a volunteer (student intern) and that the video "was not clear". Granted with the substandard video footage that contains no sound, a viewer may not fully understand what took place other than the fact that it did happen.
			As a first hand credible witness to the incident I make the following statement; The incident was in fact AN AGGRESSIVE ATTACK by the animal in question. I give this testimony based on the fact that I witnessed the animal do three things; 1) lunge at both myself and a student intern with full vigor, 2) aggressively attempted to bite both myself and the student intern mouth open and jowels flared back, and 3) showed high level aggression with its hackles up, pulling on the leash, and overt barking/growling. The animal in question did in fact bite me but as I said it did not break the skill. The only reason that no one was serious hurt by this animal was due to the fact that it was on leash at the time and the volunteer pulled it back. As the witness; I can honestly say that had the volunteer lost control of the animal, people could have been serously hurt and/or I would have been forced to take any and all necessary action to defend myself 503
M15-294846	12-May-2015	BEHAVIOR	I went to the kennel with 565 to see this animal first-hand after reading conflicting information regarding the dog's behavior. As we entered the QT area all dogs started barking loudly and excitedly. For about 5 seconds Sparky barked and stood on hind legs pawing at the kennel. We then crouched down, put our hands next to the kennel and talked to the dog. He immediately became friendly, wanted to be petted, tail wagging. I witnessed nothing that would make me believe that Sparky is not a good candidate for adoption. 555
